MINUTES

<u>CALL TO ORDER:</u> The Northeast Florida Pediatric Society (NEFPS) meeting was called to order on Wednesday, September 13, at about 8:00am by Julie Kellogg, MD, President. This meeting was rescheduled from August 30.

BUSINESS

NEW BUSINESS Dr. Allison Cato, neuropsychologist, and Nancy Barnard, director of educational intervention, from Hope Haven joined the meeting to present Dyslexia Evaluation and Resources. Hope Haven focuses on clinical, educational, advocacy and intervention, including transition programs for individuals that are transitioning into old adulthood. They have a discovery school, a specialized preschool for individuals with special needs including autism, and a transition program called Hope Academy for early adults through age 22.

Hope Haven is a fee for service model and has successfully attained grants for autism and developmental dyslexia. They have an educational reading intervention network of around 100 interventionists. The presentation is attached.

<u>School Health Program Update</u>: Dr. Beverly reported that Elizabeth Rosado, school health officer, has resigned and will be joining Angel Kids.

Flu shots will be administered to students and staff in Duval County again this year.

<u>FL Chapter - American Academy of Pediatrics (FCAAP) & FMA/CMS/AAP</u> – Dr. Rana, VP of FCAAP, reported that the 10th annual conference in Orlando was very successful with 475 members in attendance.

WCH Update: Dr. Bridgham reported that Dr. Brian Gilligan is the interim Chief Medical Officer effective when Dr. Bridgham retired and until Dr. Mark Toney begins on November 1.

Baptist has created a service line for children's health services. Creation of this service line will allow us to better coordinate care and have

a more comprehensive Wolfson Children's Health Network as opposed to our historical tendency to be more hospital centered.

Allegra pointed out that Dr. Bridgham will be supporting these efforts in his part-time role, working with our pediatric primary care

network of physicians to ensure that WCH is meeting the needs of patients in the community.
